Autumn 1	<b>Growing Up</b> In this module children consider the basic needs of humans for survival (food, water, air), the need for warmth and shelter, and additional needs for health and wellbeing (covered in more detail for humans in Module 5 and for other animals in Module 2). Children can explore the differences between life on a farm and life in a town.	<b>Moving Farm Animals - DT</b> Children can create a sliding mechanism. Autumn 2	<b>Materials - Good Choices</b> In this module children build on learning from Year 1 about different materials and their properties. The children consolidate their understanding that one type of object can be made from different materials and also that one material can be used for a number of different objects.	Christianity Christmas - Jesus as a gift from God Why do Christians believe God gave Jesus to the world?	<b>The Great Fire of London- History</b> Take your children back to 1666 and the era of the Stuarts as they find about the Great Fire of London and the effect it had on the people of the time. They will find out when, where, how and why the Great Fire happened, and explore how we know about it through the diary of Samuel Pepys and other sources. Spring 2	<b>Take Care</b> In this module children begin to learn about different ways to keep themselves healthy. During the module they consider the importance of eating a range of different types of food.	Christianity Easter - Resurrection How important is it to Christians that Jesus came back to life after his crucifixion?	<b>Nurturing Nurses- History</b> Children will learn about Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. They will learn about their remarkable life, their youth, where they travelled to and what they did in Scutari and the Crimea War. Children will learn about the lasting impact their achievements had. They will learn about these significant individuals and compare aspects of life in different periods.	<b>Puppets - DT</b> Children will be looking at a range of puppets and their features and using fabric to create a finger puppet. Summer 1	<b>The Apprentice Gardener</b> This module builds on Year 1, Module 1, Plant Detectives and Year 1, OCW: Plants, where children identified plants, named their parts, tended a garden and observed seasonal change. Children should already be aware that plants need water and sunlight; this module revisits and extends that understanding.	Islam Community and Belonging Does going to a mosque give Muslims a sense of belonging?	<b>My World and Me - Geography</b> Children will find out where the UK, the equator and the poles are on a world map and create a map with a key. They will compare the land features and climate of the UK and Ecuador as well as comparing the capital cities of the UK and Ecuador. They will find out where different animals live in the world and identify physical and human features in aerial photos.	<b>Seaside Snacks - DT</b> Children will follow instructions to make sandwiches, identify and name a variety of foods before making seaside sandwiches. They will name and describe a variety of vegetables and fruit then make edible boats. Children will make fruit sculptures taste and describe a variety of fruits, while thinking about their shape and colour. Finally children will make edible cake decorations, create frozen seaside snacks and design a seaside picnic.	<b>Relationships</b> Children will identify different types of relationships, appropriate physical contact, conflict resolution, expressing appreciation in their relationships and explore which secrets are good to keep and which are not.	<b>Friendship Song</b> (Pop)  A song about being friends. They use this developing understanding of the different animals living in a habitat to build up simple food chains.
