



HOMEWORK POLICY

OVERVIEW

We believe that it is important to build strong links between home and school. At all times children will be encouraged to read at home and this may involve learners taking reading books home on a regular basis, reading with or to adults at home. We are committed to promoting parental involvement in education and so parents will be encouraged to help and support their children.

In order to support the completion of homework it will be given out on a Thursday and is not required back into school until the following Tuesday.

OBJECTIVES

1. To extend the learning process beyond the school day.
2. To involve learners and their parents in teaching and learning.
3. To build upon teaching and learning in school.
4. To reinforce and extend learning.

STRATEGIES

1. Homework will be linked to learning which has taken place in the classroom
2. Homework may be used to extend learning which has taken place in the classroom
3. Homework may be used to rehearse key skills such as times tables, calculations, spellings, grammar
4. Homework may be used to prepare for or research a new topic

OUTCOMES

This policy will ensure that a sensible approach will be taken by all and that learners will benefit through the co-operation of home and school by extending learning beyond the school day.

In order to ensure that children are not disadvantaged in comparison to their peers, where homework is not completed provision will be made for them do so within the school day.
